How did you first get involved in ICP

DANIELLE: Lifest got involved with EC when I was choosing my Bat Mitzyah project, and I found FC's Mitzyah Volunteer Program (MVP). The objective of the program is to ease you into EC and it did. After MVP, I just wanted to jump right in.

DANIEL: FC has always been a part of my life. Growing up, my siblings and parents volunteered for EC and my father used to run the art sessions. It wasn't really a question of whether or not I would do FC. it was more a question of when I would start.
